The Extreme Dangers of Fracking

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Fracking is the practice of withdrawing natural gas, oil, coal, or other petroleum products by forcing pressure and fracturing the earth. This is an unfortunate situation that is being pursued for financial gain, and it is totally unnecessary. However, it is occurring partly because of greed and partly because of a lack of other technologies and a belief that this is a really good technology, when it is not.

It must be understood though, that such things as fracking coal, oil, and natural gas are all interrelated topics. And we will be speaking to you about these various topics separately.

For the moment we will address singularly the issue of fracking because this creates damage to the earth in ways that most scientists are only beginning to appreciate. What is happening when pressure is forced into the earth to fracture veins, to recover a product from the earth, or to force it from the earth, even under pressure, is that extraneous pressure is being pushed into the earth.

Now, the earth itself is already a composite of layers, and these are all different materials and different strengths. So, when you introduce a foreign pressure into the earth, the layers of the earth actually begin to break and crack at different rates according to *their* strength and resistance. Now, this does happen somewhat naturally over a period of millions and millions of years. And, of course, this happens when there are volcanoes and earthquakes or when magma spews up from a lower level of the earth to an upper level. But you have land that you consider to be stable. And when you introduce these pressures, you are actually fracturing layers of the earth indiscriminately. If you had the ability to do this in a more discriminate fashion, it would not be as hazardous, but it would still be hazardous because you always have that slight, unexpected consequence to deal with.

So what is the result? The result is that you are weakening areas that are considered stable, areas where mankind has built homes, stores, shopping centers, et cetera, for prolonged periods of time. And suddenly this ground becomes unstable because several miles, maybe even *many* miles away, someone is causing an instability factor. So, the result is that you are having a multitude of small earthquakes in unexpected areas.

Now you are beginning to realize that this is the case, and you are altering the practice slightly to anticipate these issues; however, you have not yet scientifically understood that doing so in one area and then fracturing the earth in another area, and then in another, creating small disruptions, that these small disruptions begin to link together to create greater disruptions. So, fracking is an issue in the very stability of the earth itself that can, does, and will continue to cause earthquakes of a greater and greater magnitude.

But that is not all of the problem; for you say, you are going to fracture the earth, force water in, and pull up a particular element. But you are going through various layers of the earth and suddenly other gases escape. Things that have been dormant for millions of years are able to escape. You say, what problem can that be? But you are talking about not just gases which can impact the ozone layer, can impact global warming, but you are also talking about the possibility of actually exposing bacteria and

The hazard of what you are doing is so much greater than the small gain that you can make from it. Therefore, we are telling you that, if you are to continue this practice of fracking, you must learn to do it properly, learn to isolate it to a particular stratum of the earth, and learn to extract only that which is desired, without creating the terrible imbalances in pressure that you are currently creating. For you run the risk—should we not even say run the risk—you are already creating and intensifying the risk of dangers to humanity through earthquakes, through disease, and through global warming.
